The Issue is pg 109 CE-P2 Coastal Environment Identity should include The seaward extent, extends out to the 12 nautical mile limit as in pg 113 M1. There should be mapping done similar to the land, as in overlays identifying areas set aside for full or partial protection of marine biodiversity under legislation; Southern Inshore fisheries imput, location of sewage outlets in the sea; marine farms added in the future; Marine biodiversity areas ie. Kelp ,penguin foraging..... with integrated imput from Niwa, fisheries DOC to form current baseline info. To do justice to Resource Management of Marine Biodiversity in the seaward boundaries; there is a need to create another Policy CE -P14 (note Kai Tahu CE -Pg113 13 (5))

Monitor & Manage Seaward CoastalEnvironment.(1) the need for a MonitoringStrategy.(2) the need to respectthe marine environment with inter gratedmanagement.
