Widespread throughout Aotearoa New Zealand on bodies of freshwater. Colonised from Australia, first breeding at Ōkārito Lagoon in 1950, and in Otago since 1983.

New Zealand native

A large white waterbird with yellow and red face markings, long black legs and a spoon-shaped bill. Breeding adults gain buff breasts and a crown of head plumes. Young birds have shorter bills and black wingtips. Rarely vocalises. Sweeps bill side to side underwater to catch fish and invertebrates.
