Comments re Otago Regional Council feedback

<u>Water</u>; New Zealand has lost the plot about water quality and water amounts. I would blame this fully on the government in Wellington. Too much playing politics and not enough good, honest, open government.

I actually do not believe the Otago Regional Council data on water quality. I would say water quality everywhere is getting worse. We allow all sorts of run off, especially from farms, to enter water races and streams and rivers and lakes, and of course the sea. Very focused work will be need to even begin to improve things. The government in Wellington, and that includes all past governments, done really care.

Why have we not required riparian planting and fencing on all farms?

My only measure is that all water quality, everywhere, is improving. If it is not then we fail.

It is long past time for all councils, regional and city, to stand up and oppose any silly ideas about water that originate from NZ Government. ic., the recent thing re water quality improvement over 40 years. This surely is a joke?

I suggest we need a department of water in the NZ Government. The present scattered regulation by councils can not work to address overall water issues.

Re Dairy Farm Inspections; some dairy farms are a big problem. I suggest a scheme that rates dairy farms into classes 1, 2 or 3. This can be done through farm advisers, councils, banks, etc, etc. A class 1 dairy farm would have no issues over one year. A class 5 would require continual monitoring, the cost of which would to some extent be passed on to the farm.

All water take must be public, with the amount, owner, company, etc listed. Where a farm or company has a water take all the owners must be listed by name.

If more money is needed then let's raise general taxes. It is long past time for us to give up the Mantra Politics of the only game in town being lowering taxes.

I can not reply to the words "Significance" and "Engagement." These are bureaucratic speak words that have no real meaning, even for you bureaucrats.

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## Fresh Water Standards.

I have always believed that the Treaty of Waitangi made provision for Maori who had an aquatic derived diet, by ensuring their water source. The water that sustained the traditional fishing grounds (wetlands, waterways and lakes) was vested in the local livi. Thereby they were assured of their traditional food source.

In all the historic books I have read, Lakes Waihela and Waipouri, and the South Taier; wetlands, feature prominently as an iwi food source. I also know of sites on the Waihola / Taieri Mouth hills where I have seen Maori ovens. It seems, therefore, that the Waihola catchment complies with the Treaty of Waitangi arrangement for traditional Maori aquatic food provision — i.e. the water is vested in the local iwi.

Yet in all their proposals and legislation re. Fresh water quality, both Central Government and Local Authorities, appear to be ignoring the Treaty of Waltangi provisions, that much of this water belongs to Macri.

(4): It was helpful to see the photographs of of the elected councillors. It was a pity that it didn't include (a) a brief resume on each and (b) their annual payments. Surely, in the name of 'transparency,' a ratepayer is entitled to know what their reward for service is.

(5): That rates are to increase is hardly surprising (thank goodness for Port Otago and the extra financial help of \$1.5 million). No matter how carefully the booklet information was studied this ratepayer was left with the feeling the ORC was run completely on the old 'cost-plus' basis.

(6): Given the captive ratepayers need and deserve transparency why was information about about staff completely absent. No staff numbers, no brief profiles including any qualifications of senior staff. It all seemed extremely "hush-hush" to this reader. If such information is worthwhile the elected councilors would be up on the headquarters roof shouting: "Look at this staff talent. No! Not a word.

(7): Second page. A photo of a happy men enjoying a 'cuppa' but a caption to explain what it meant was absent. This photo would make any hard boiled feminist jump up and down in outrage. Does this mean male staff sit round supping 'gumboot tea' most of the day?

(8): Page 3 with its explanation of where the ORC dollar spend goes is shear window dressing. What is the total dollar take? What is the actual dollar spend on staff? What is the actual dollar spend on cleaning and maintenance of its nine buildings. These facts even in the percent spend were missing. Transparency?

(9): On page 4 the information is to deliver transparency to the ratepayer gets worse. Each income item in the circle gets a percentage, a colour and a place in the circle. But what does general rates at 12 percent actually mean in dollars and cents ? It really smacks of keeping the ratepayers in the dark like mushrooms and feeding them 'bulls-wool.'

(10): Page 5 shows a district estimated proposed rates. A boxed panel suggests ratepayers should go on line to access "our online calculator." What a cheek! What a complete lack of sensitivity toward the mature ratepayer who might not not even have a computer never mind a cell phone. This is rank ORC insensitivity. But by 2050 all ratepayers will be computer savvy and all those pests will be gone from Aotearoa eh?

(11): Civil Defense (CDEM): "This year we're proposing to appoint new staff training and education role." Bottler! Where is the transparency? How many staff? At what cost? We live in a free market democracy but the booklet reads more like it's from a socialist command economy "You do as you are told to pay, and we'll do as we like." Two choices: Uniform targeted rate, or a 50-50% job. Cost of \$2.4 million: No explanation. No transparency. "Just, there it is you captured ratepayers!" I just don't believe it.

(12): Page 7 rural water. This is really beyond the 'pail!'. On my file I have a number of cases where pure, untreated human sewerage was flushed into the Clutha and lakes from accidents, misadventure, poor maintenance and the culprits were never fined.

(13): The Young River Valley Dam. Remember this? The ORC is adverse to dangerous dams. This one is reportedly 579,2 metres deep and 1.5km long But this dam formed as a result of a land slip without an RMA consent in September 2007 – vesterday in the scheme of things --still it has no safety regulation inspection. In the Otago Daily Times 17/12/13 the Department of Conservation (DOC) issued a 'high alert" for the dam. In relation to the

reduced water level could have been a result with the ORC monitoring equipment (???). The ODT report said DOC issued a high alert warning for the valley until the situation could be investigated. According to an ODT report (17/6/11) by John Gibb, the ORC is required by law to update its policy on overseeing dangerous dams but was still hampered by a lack of dam safety regulations. However, Gibb reported regional councils already had statutory powers to take action against dams it deemed to be dangerous and it could act immediately if it considered any dam posed "an immediate danger to people, property or the environment. " The Young River Valley dam was constructed by an act of nature .

My questions are (1); Why hasn't the ORC kept the ratepayers/public informed about the affairs relating to this illegal dam? (2): Why wasn't the legal duties of the ORC outlined in its 'Your Feedback Please?' (3) what has been done in regard its policies relating to dangerous dams such as the Young River Valley? (4) The cost of monitoring dams generally including those belonging to the Dunedin City Council. Not a word. This just isn't good enough!

(13): No mention of urban contamination of rural waterways. The Albert Town incident springs instantly to mind. Remember ? "We're proposing to carry out catchment studies in five catchment every year. These will involve intensive water sampling." In the **Palmerston** sewerage scheme recently completed with paddock sprinklers on the opposite side of the Shag River to the sewerage ponds. How rigorous is the connecting pipe construction between these two parts of the scheme? What is the charice of a major flood busting the connecting pipe that runs through (underneath?) the Shag River?. If such event occurred there would a vast amount of contaminated water flow down the Shag River. What local body organisation would be to blame bearing in mind the Shag River picked up the title of the cleanest waterway a year or so ago. Meanwhile the targeted rate will increase from \$639,000 to \$1,190,00 – up 85 % – Phew!!

(14): Page 8. Minimum flows: A lack of information but there was plenty of space on the page. How many ratepayers will be affected by this? How much money is there in the water management reserve? Where is this fund invested? Come-on the ORC, some transparency please!

(15): Page 9. What in tar-nation is a regional body being engaged in a business of public transport. Sell it off allowing real entrepreneurs to do the business. Local body bureaucrats are not business orientated they work off budgets gained from the captive rate-taxpayers. If the books don't balance just up the rates.

(15): Page 10. Office space is notable for a complete lack of information. How many staff need office space? Why Queenstown? Isn't there another place handy to the lake etc? How much is the estimated cost of the Queenstown office. Again the spectre of a cost plus mentality which in the real world of hard knocks, private enterprise and efficiency would bring the ORC business to its knees

(16): The Lower Waitaki River Control Scheme -- what do you think?. I think the entire trade-off between the ORC and Environment Canterbury is pure 'Voodoo!'. Who -- what- did the external review? How much did it cost? Lack of transparency again. Ratepayers need substantial evidence what "benefits the scheme provides beyond the targeted rate area."

(17): Page 10. Other new activities. (a) Lake snow. Why not contract out the research? Is there any Govt., funding? After Lake Snow is contained there will be some other micro-organism needing ORC attention and so on ad-infinitum. (b) Ditto for 'lake restoration. Where is the information about untreated sewerage escape-release into the Clutha River and lakes. Strange how no prosecutions were not made against local bodies. (c)Wallaby control. A lack of supporting information, "wallables have the potential to significantly impact Otago" \$274,000 from the general rate -- why not \$275,000? What will this spend achieve. Is this 'impact' hush-hush for us ratepayers. Why not financially support research into domesticating them for export as was done for deer and for Northland possums (bush bears) to Taiwan some years ago? As a nation we walk on diamonds, (d) Climate change. South Dunedin flooding and the ORC working with the DCC " to develop and deliver a responsive plan." Too late the horse has bolted. Why didn't the ORC prosecute the DCC for neglect of its drainage responsibilities. Is it a 'toothless tiger' when it comes to dealing with 'dodgy' local bodies? (e) Wilding pines. The Government in its wisdom introduced this an other pines, and catchment boards, it thought would be useful in preventing Aptearoa going down to the sea in slips back in the 1940s and 50s. Modern knowledge now has it that earth quakes and land movement is as much to blame as was once thought to be caused by vegetation removal by land raping, burning, over stocking farmers.' Remember when the Kingston township was sprayed over during a wilding pine eradication operation. That made population jump up and down. Like rabbits and sycamores they will be here far tanger than humans. Read Jim Childrstones latest publication of how wilding oines can have a useful future. (f) Dunedin Building Review. (18) Financial page 11. Under fees and charges the reader finds the same old, same old, simplistic 'cost-plus' beaurcatic mentality. Technical-scientist hourly rate under scale of charges rises from \$115 to \$120 an hour. Up about 4.5%. We captured ratepayers have to pay the local body charges. We cannot transfer our rate generated business to Mitre 10 or Bunnings, yet council workers are free to have commercial congress with any firm.

(19): General Rates page 12. Of \$7.250.000 is divided by 115,000 rate[payers is about \$63. The transparency of this section is appalling: "We have around 115,000 rateoayers. A 1% general rate represents around \$63,000 across all rateoayers. So despite the percentage being 14%, the total dollar increase to the individual rate payer is relatively low." What a load of 'gobbly-gook'. Pure voodoo!

## My Conclusion

The ORC Feedback publication is over produced on quality paper. A news print would have been adequate. The feedback will be small and far between. Most copies will be iquickly scanned and consigned to the rubbish,

The entire publication including the text comes across as poorly transparent ORC propaganda rather than a genuine effort to inform its captive ratepayers. Not a mention of small, medium enterprises in terms of some encouragement of say a lower rate. If 10 mas a top mark than this ORC effort, for all the reasons stated would rate no better than a 4 accompanied by the observation: "Should do much better." All ORC staff, excluding the elected councillors who are required to face the voters, enjoy a 'cost-plus' featherbed with their income and annual raward based on budget requirements not market realities.

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#### Submission to Otago Regional Council Annual Submissions 2017 By Waitaki Community Gardens

#### Dear Councillors,

The Waitaki Community Gardens is submitting this year to seek your support to bring the Enviroschools programme to schools and students in the Waitaki District as part of the annual and long term plans.

This programme provides supplementary education for children in schools that covers gardening, cooking, waste management, and environmental protection. Schools in all other parts of Otago – and indeed in most other parts of New Zealand – have access to the programme which is funded by local councils, and we think it's time that Waitaki schools and students had the same opportunity.

We have considerable support from school staff, parents and local ratepayers who agree life skills in gardening, cooking and living more sustainably are fundamental to the future of our children and wellbeing of our district. We have included some letters of support from local principals in the appendix of our submission to share their perspectives.

Please note that we would like to speak to this submission.

#### What is Enviroschools?

Enviroschools is a nationwide programme supporting over 1000 schools and early childhood centers to adopt a whole-school approach to sustainability. It empowers school-age children with skills, knowledge and experiences to lead on 21 issues, and revitalize the schools, communities, ecosystems and neighbourhoods that they are a part of - producing rich biodiversity, healthy water, clean energy, healthy food and nurturing environments. Whilst the programme is tailored to the needs of each participating school, there are some core parts to the programme:

- Each participating school is provided with an Enviroschools kit, that provides a wide range of units that cover sustainability measures and integrate with NZ Curriculum Unit Standards.
- Each participating school is supported by an Enviroschools Facilitator, who works with the school to support their projects and processes.
- Many Enviroschools establish an Envirogroup with representatives from each class. This group
  is responsible for collating school issues to explore, plan project development, and
  representatives report progress back to their classmates or to the school as a whole.

#### How does it work?

As an example of how an Enviroschools project might run, an Envirogroup may decide to reduce waste as an issue at their school. The Enviroschools Facilitator will work with the school staff and students to help conduct a waste audit of all the school bins, support teachers to explore waste concepts and run relevant activities from the Enviroschools kit. This could include building a compost bin and creating a recycling station thereby reducing the waste going to landfill and supporting the school to keep the process going.

By taking a waste audit at the beginning and measuring again once processes are put in place, students can record their impact in waste reduction, as more food waste is composted, processes avoid excess packaging, recyclable material recycled, and general waste to landfill reduces. Through exploration, discovery and connections with the environment, students experience how to make decisions and take action to improve the physical and social environment of schools and local neighborhoods.



#### What are the benefits?

For students, benefits include student knowledge and understanding of how people can make plans and effect changes to make their social and physical environment a better, more sustainable place. Students understand the links between all that is present in their place and their community. Additionally, students acquire skills in working together, making decisions, research, planning, and hands on practical ways to engage with the curriculum and learning. Through engaging in real action projects, they learn how to be active citizens, participating in local decision-making.

For participating schools, benefits include increased pride and responsibility in caring for the school environment, healthier school grounds, financial savings by saving resources, more engaged and motivated students, and strengthening links with whanau, local community and the environment. As one participating school reported, "children are more empowered as caretakers of our environment."

Finally, in terms of <u>benefits for local families and our wider community</u>, Enviroschools encourage schools and community to work together to improve community and environmental outcomes, increase understanding of cultural diversity and Maori perspectives,spread sustainable-living knowledge from school to home, and strengthen attitudes of care, social responsibility, and creativity. As one observer reported, "the students' efforts are being recognized by the community and the students value the importance of contributing and improving biodiversity and health waterways".

#### What's the evidence it works?

In 2014, a comprehensive census of Enviroschools was conducted to evaluate their impact and outcomes. A wide range of 688 schools from all deciles, sectors, and regions participated in the evaluation.

- 100% of participating schools reported having a range of waste minimization plans and actions in place.
- 97% of Enviroschools are growing and harvesting produce from their school gardens and orchards.
- 96% of Enviroschools are undertaking biodiversity projects in collaboration with their local communities with 86,859 trees planted in 2014.
- 75% of Enviroschools are undertaking a range of actions to conserve and improve water, quality, including 19,264 metros of riparian plantings in 2014.
- 69% of Enviroschools are tackling energy usage projects, including actions for sustainable transport (47%) and energy conservation actions (34%).

Additionally, Enviroschools contributed to a range of other outcomes including chizenship, community engagement, health, cultural understanding, and motivated learners. Enviroschools foster significant community collaboration through biodiversity projects, creating leadership pathways for students and real connections to families and local communities.

Enviroschools across New Zealand are locally implementing many objectives in WDC's Annual Plan: improving water quality, development and implementation of our District Biodiversity Strategy, improving air quality, increasing community engagement, as well as education abour waste management.

#### **Regional and National Structure of Enviroschools**

The Enviroschools programme is supported nationally by the Toimata Foundation. Each local TLA is responsible for funding and facilitation in their district.



Across Otago, all other TLAs are currently supporting Enviroschools facilitation - 63 Enviroschools working with a total of 13,594 students.

- Dunedin funded by the Dunedin City Council
- Central Otago funded by the Central Otago District Council and the Central Otago Rural Education Activities Programme,
- Clutha funded by Clutha District Council,
- Queenstown Lakes funded by Queenstown Lakes District Council and Wanaka Wastebusters.

The Waitaki district is the only part of Otago with where schools have no access to the Enviroschools programme. The Waitaki Community Gardens is currently facilitating a similar initiative called Kids Growing at no cost to schools, teaching life skills in gardening, cooking and waste management. However, funding for programme delivery is inconsistent and difficult to secure, so we believe that our local council should support our local children learning these life skills by funding Waitaki EnviroSchools.

#### Local Expressions of Interest and Logistics

Enviroschools staff in Dunedin are happy to support the Waitaki District Council (WDC) to develop and implement the Enviroschools initiative. The Waitaki District would need to fund the cost of training and employing an Enviroschools Facilitator for North Otago, as well as the cost of Enviroschools kits for each participating school.

The Waitaki Community Gardens currently employs a School Gardens' Coordioator and works with 12 local primary schools (as well as 1 high school and 1 pre-school) on a weekly basis, facilitating weekly educational activities in the school garden. We believe there are strong synergies between the work undertaken by the Gardens, and the broader Enviroschools programme. If WDC decides to support the Enviroschools initiative in North Otago, the facilitator role could be contracted out to Waitaki Community Gardens.

A projected annual budget for Waitaki Enviroschools is provided below, including 40 weeks' facilitation, facilitator training, travel and programme delivery. Periodic reviews will be undertaken at baseline, after six months, and one year to evaluate school satisfaction, program impact and outcomes.

Evaluation reports will be provided to schools and WDC so they can evaluate the benefits of ongoing participation and funding.


