# Topic 1: Are we focusing on the right things in the plan?

#### Tell us more:

I think these are all important points to focus on. I take the bus between Warrington daily and it would be great if passenger experience and trust in our bus system would be improved (since, due to buses often being late, the level of trust currently is not high). Sustainability is, of course important. I think that is very important to remember that, by keeping the bus fares low, people will actually continue to take the bus in from Warrington and further away. If the fares go up, it will no longer make financial sense for us living in Warrington to take the bus and I predict that numbers of people taking the bus would drop drastically - we'd instead just drive our cars into work and that wouldn't be a very sustainable option.

# Topic 2: Should we support community transport services in smaller towns and rural areas?

**Our proposal:** we are considering the establishment of a subsidised community transport programme providing support for transport services in Otago's smaller towns and rural areas. **What do you think about this proposal?**

## Topic 3: Should we increase our passenger fares?

**Our proposal:** we are considering increasing the base fare for adult Bee Card passengers from \$2 to \$2.50. This would effectively increase bus fares for all passengers using Bee Cards by 25%. **What do you think about this proposal?**

#### Tell us more:

## Topic 4: Should we charge more for longer trips?

**Our proposal:** we are considering introducing a zone fare system to our bus networks in Dunedin and Queenstown. Under this system, passengers travelling further distances across multiple zones will pay a higher fare than those travelling short distances within one zone. **What do you think about this proposal?**

#### Tell us more:

As I mentioned above, I do not think that the council should charge more for longer trip. If the fares would be raised to, say 5 NZD, this will bring a trip from Warrington to Dunedin and back to 10 NZD. By then, it is actually cheaper for many of us to just drive, which would be bad for the environment and makes no body any happier. We already have a bus that only comes once in the morning and comes back once in the afternoon, and is often late. If it then also becomes more expensive, I would predict that for many of us that take the bus in, it will no longer be worth it to take the bus.

# Topic 5: Should we keep our free fares for children (5-12 years)?

#### Our proposal:

A. Retain free fares (100% discount) for children (5-12 years), AND

B. Standardise our concession discount for youth (13-18 years) to 40% across both the Dunedin and



Queenstown networks. For example, if the adult fare is \$2, youth pay \$1.20, or if the adult fare is \$2.50, youth pay \$1.50.
