

Visitor Moorings

- 1) The Otago Regional Council has available two swing moorings that may be used by visiting vessels.
- 2) Location of Deborah Bay mooring 45°48.142S 170°37.782E. Deborah Bay has a maximum vessel length of 12 metres.
- 3) Location of Careys Bay mooring 45°48.329S 170°37.683E. Careys Bay has a maximum of 20 meters.

How to Book.

Bookings must be submitted on this form and sent to the Otago Regional Council Harbourmaster email harbourmaster@orc.govt.nz.

The Harbourmasters office can be contacted by phone 0272010592, Harbour Control VHF 14 or phone 034729882.

Confirmation must come from the Harbourmasters Office and signed by the Harbourmaster.

Terms and Conditions:

- The Otago Regional Council (ORC) has two visitor swing moorings available to be used by visiting vessels or other vessels by arrangement with the Harbourmaster's office.
- Both moorings are controlled by the ORC Harbourmasters Office, the harbourmasters office can be contacted at harbourmaster@orc.govt.nz or 0272010592.
- The maximum allowed stay is 48 hours (free of charge) in a 6-month period, or by arrangement with the Harbourmasters office. Any longer period will be agreed with the Harbourmaster office and be charged at \$40 per night.
- The booking is for the listed vessel only and cannot be transferred.
- Only vessels that do not exceed the maximum vessel length may use the Otago Regional Council visitor Moorings.
- Vessels using the ORC visitor moorings are liable for any damage.
- At the Harbourmaster discretion, the booking may be cancelled without notice, at any time.
- If the booking is cancelled, the vessel must be removed from the mooring immediately.
- All Bylaws must be followed, including pollution regulations.
- If the vessel is not removed from the mooring at the end of the permitted stay, the Otago Regional Council may do so, and store or destroy, at its discretion, the costs being the liability of the owner.
- The Otago Regional Council or Harbourmasters office shall not be liable for any claims, damages, liabilities, loses or expenses caused directly or indirectly using the ORC visitor moorings.
- All black water and rubbish must be retained on board and disposed of ashore.
- Vessels using Otago Regional Council visitors' moorings should carry vessel insurance.
- The owner of the vessel must ensure that all rules and bylaws are followed, at all times.
- The vessel owner must indemnify and hold blameless, the Otago Regional Council and the Harbourmaster against any claim, damages, liabilities, losses or expenses what so ever arising out or in connection with the use of the ORC visitor moorings.
- All ORC Legal costs and other costs (including staff times at normal rates) of enforcing the terms and conditions are payable by the owner
