### **Notes to Mooring Owner**

- (1) A mooring location may only be transferred if it holds a current Coastal Permit, and is from/to Otago, Karitane, Moeraki or Oamaru Harbours.
- (2) Upon receipt of this form, the Otago Regional Council will inform the applicant in writing of whether the transfer has been approved and, if approved, re-issue the Coastal Permit with amended GPS coordinates. The transfer is subject to the approval of the Council's Harbour Master.
