New debris flood hazard findings for the Roxburgh area

A new study has been carried out on the debris flood hazard and associated risks from Coal Creek to Dumbarton.

For each of the 13 creeks in the study area, the new mapping identifies areas where debris floods are more likely to occur. The study also identifies possible effects on people, places and key infrastructure.

What is a debris flood?

Debris floods are fast-moving flows of water and debris that can cause harm to people and property. They can be triggered by heavy rainfall, such as severe thunderstorms, along the Old Man Range.

Understanding these potential hazards helps us all stay safer, protect what we value and plan for the future.
