New Zealand native

A distinctive waterbird with large chestnut crests and a sharp bill. Leaving the water only to nest, it lumbers about on land with legs set far back on the body and lobed toes. Constructs floating nests of lakeweed in spring. Sometimes gives rhythmic grunts and growls.
