Breeds in native forest along the Otago coastline and around Rakiura / Stewart Island, but most of the population inhabits the subantarctic Maungahuka / Motu Maha / Auckland Islands and Motu Ihupuku / Campbell Islands. Forages in the open ocean, typically 2–25 km from shore.

- Muaupoko / Otago Peninsula
- Te Ākau Tai Toka / The Catlins

New Zealand endemic

A large yet shy penguin with countershaded plumage and a heavy pink bill. Adults have pale yellow feathering surrounding their yellow eyes. Sits low in the water and dives at speed in pursuit of fish. Gives piercing 'bray' and 'honk' calls.
