## Range:

Breeds locally on the subantarctic Maungahuka / Motu Maha / Auckland Islands, Motu Ihupuku / Campbell Island and Moutere Mahue / Antipodes Island, as well as on Rēkohu / Wharekauri / Chatham Islands, and on islands across the Southern Ocean. Regularly observed in mainland Aotearoa New Zealand waters year-round.

#### New Zealand native

A bulky brown seabird with a huge pale orange bill that is dark reddish-brown at the tip. Young birds whiten from their face outwards as they age. Appears hunchbacked and broad-winged in flight. Opportunistic diet of fish, squid, krill, birds and carrion such as dead seals and even whales, which can attract huge aggregations.
