Inshore waters of mainland Aotearoa New Zealand from spring until autumn (less common further south). Breeds in the Arctic Circle before migrating to the Southern Hemisphere for the summer.

#### New Zealand native

A stocky yet sleek seabird with several variable plumage morphs. The dark morph has entirely blackish-brown colouring, while the pale morph has a buff face and a white belly. Many birds are between the two, but all have a long, pointed tail and wings with white patches underneath. Active and graceful flight, often in pursuit of terns for their catch.
